To be frank, I'm not sure how much of the material I've absorbed. After being overloaded with information for two whole days, being told that I have to write a closed book test at the end was very stressful. The material was presented too quickly and for learners like myself, it did not allow time for absorbing the material enough to feel confident with writing the exam immediately after. Perhaps extending the course to add another day or building in activities that would speak to different types of learners coming from different backgrounds would allow the course to reach its full potential. I came into this course with VERY LITTLE knowledge with this information and I struggled to find the logic of the order. That being said, I did appreciate the efforts of all the instructors and I know they did the best with what they were given.

This course needs to be overhauled in its entirety.

The depth in which the toxicology is presented is deep. A lot of time explaining and reviewing pathophysiology and anatomy. Both are good however, both can be done during a pre-course.

Similar to that of PALS and hybrid ACLS courses, this course should have a 4-6 hour precourse, with videos and explanations with knowledge tests along the way. From basics to complicated matters. The pre-course, once completed, allows entry into the course.

After a generalized review, the actual course should focus on problem-based learning and table-top exercises. Also, in the way of course process, text books are great (especially not online) however pocket-cards or app references would be a tremendous addition. These cards / apps should be allowed during testing if there is any final test. In the real world, where technology is available, or easy resources are available, and time is of the essence, memory will not always be accurate. Cards with toxidromes, wisdom pearls, antidotes, dosing guides, and possible check-lists would be the most beneficial.

The instructors were great. The information was very detailed and presented well.

Teaching to pass a test is circa 1998-2002. Teaching to be realistic and practical would be the most beneficial, especially for those in the field.






